AMERICAN EXPLORER & ARMY OFFICER WHO HELPED THE AMERICANS IN THE BEAR FLAG REVOLT

- 2.) GEN. Z. TAYLOR WAS RELIEVED OF HIS COMMAND OF THE U.S. ARMY TOP COMMAND WENT TO WINFIELD SCOTT

#### TREATY OF GUADALUPE-HIDALGO

- U.S GOT MEXICAN CESSION (MOST OF PRESENT-DAY SW U.S.) FOR \$15 MILLION
- U.S. GOV'T AGREED TO PAY \$3 MILLION OWED IN PRIVATE DEBTS TO MEXICO
- MEXICANS LIVING IN THE "MEXICAN CESSION" WOULD BE GRANTED CIVIL LIBERTIES

LAND GIVEN TO THE U.S. AS PART OF THE TREATY OF GUADALUPE-HIDALGO
LANDS THAT MADE UP MOST OF TODAY'S WEST/SW
STATES

Where was the Gadsden Purchase and why was it purchased?

SOUTHERN PARTS OF ARIZONA & NEW MEXICO
PURCHASED FOR \$10 MILLION TO BUILD A SOUTHERN
TRANSCONTINENTAL RAILROAD

What conflicts did American settlers, Native Americans and Mexican Americans in the Mexican Cession experience?

- LEGAL, ECONOMIC & SOCIAL DISCRIMINATION
- DISPUTES OVER LAND RIGHTS & OWNERSHIP

 LACK OF RESPECT FOR NATIVE CULTURE & TRADITIONS Why were water rights so important in the American Southwest?

DRY CLIMATE OF THE WEST DID NOT ALLOW FOR LARGE-SCALE AGRICULTURE DAMS, CANALS, & IRRIGATION WERE NECESSARY TO MOVE WATER TO FIELDS THIS WENT AGAINST TRADITIONAL PRACTICES OF THE EAST
