The Preamble:

We the People of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union,	The idea that the best and most effective government is one that is created by its citizens ("more perfect" - better government than under the Articles of Confederation)
Establish Justice,	Create a system of fair and equitable laws
Insure domestic tranquility,	Make sure that everything runs smoothly and peacefully within the nation's borders (direct response to "Shays's Rebellion")
Provide for the common defense,	Establish and maintain an armed force to protect the nation (shift away from state militias)
Promote the general Welfare, and	To make laws that encourage the prosperity (economic health) of both the people and the nation
Secure the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our posterity	Make sure that the freedoms that were fought for and won in the American Revolution would last for generations to come.
Do ordain and establish this Constitution for the United States of America	Officially make the Constitution the "law of the land"
What is "Popular Sovereignty?"	The idea that the power of government comes from the people of a nation (This is an "Enlightenment Idea")

What is the purpose of Article I?	Outlines / explains the purpose & function of the LEGISLATIVE BRANCH
Why was Clause 18 of Section 8 of this Article added to the Constitu- tion?	Allows Congress the authority to make laws for situations that may come up in the future
What is the purpose of Article II?	Outlines / explains purpose & function of the EXECUTIVE BRANCH
What is the purpose of Article III?	Explains the purpose & function of the JUDICIAL BRANCH
What is <i>Treason</i> ?	The act of willfully going against your "home" nation – intent to harm ("betrayal")
What is the MAIN IDEA of Article IV?	Established the Rules for Relations Among the States
	States must recognize other states' official documents
What are the FOUR (4) parts of Article IV?	Guarantees citizenship across state lines & Establishes the duty of <i>Extradition</i> (states must hand over people accused of a crime in another state)
	Sets up guidelines for admission of new states
	Guarantees to the states (Republican form of gov't, protection against invasion, protections against domestic violence when requested)

What topic is discussed in Article V?	Methods of amendment (or "how to make changes to the U.S. Constitution")
What are the THREE (3) provisions con- tained in Article VI?	The National government will pay all states debts that were created during the period under the Articles of Confederation The U.S. Constitution is the highest law in the land Establishes the oath of office taken by elected officials
What topic is covered in Article VII?	Ratification of the Constitution (9 out of the original 13 states needed)
